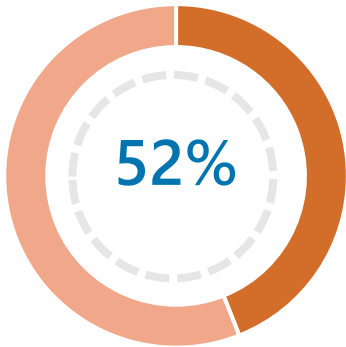
## ABOUT STATE PUBLIC HEALTH

In Arizona, trauma death rates have declined by 29% since 2006 and more than 5,200 lives have been saved.

Arizona's progress in reducing injury and trauma mortality has been accomplished by increasing access to trauma centers in rural communities and helping EMS personnel implement best practices for patients.

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## CDC 2018 OPIOID OVERDOSE CRISIS

### FUNDING

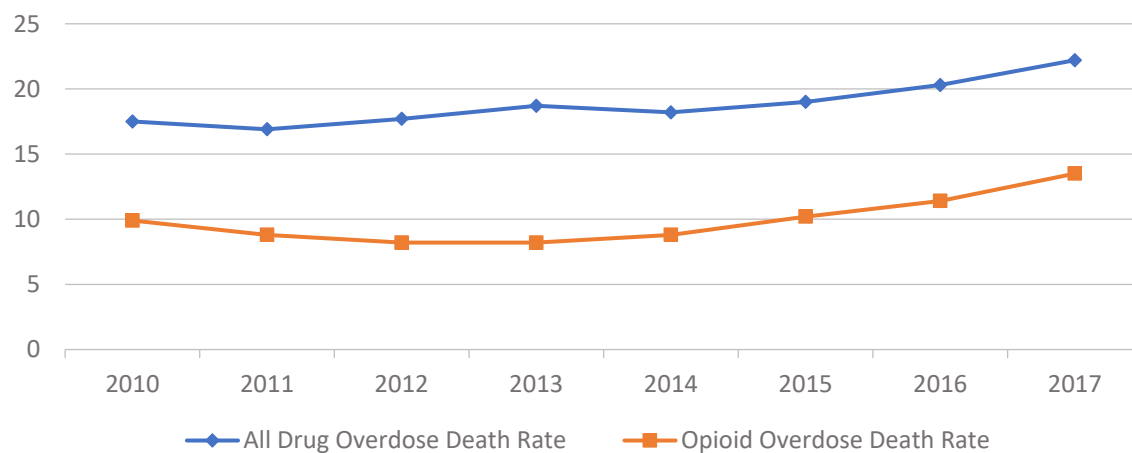
**Year 1 (FY19) \$6,700,713**

This funding will support Arizona in working to prevent opioid-related overdoses, deaths, and other outcomes. It will advance the understanding of the epidemic and scale-up prevention and response activities, including improving the timeliness of data. Specifically:

- Increasing local linkages to care that connect patients who have experience, or are at risk for experiencing an opioid overdose to available treatment and wrap around services
- Ongoing support of the Arizona Opioid Assistance and Referral (OAR) line to provide 24/7 provider consultation services, virtual case management, and patient follow-up
- Developing local Drug Overdose Fatality Review Teams to identify circumstances surrounding drug overdose deaths, and implement data-driven recommendations for reducing drug overdose fatalities
