The form must include the reasons for declining one or more required vaccines, statement from a physician verifying the physician reviewed the benefits and risks of vaccination consistent with CDC guidance, and an acknowledgement that the child may be prohibited from attending school in the event of an outbreak	Did not pass

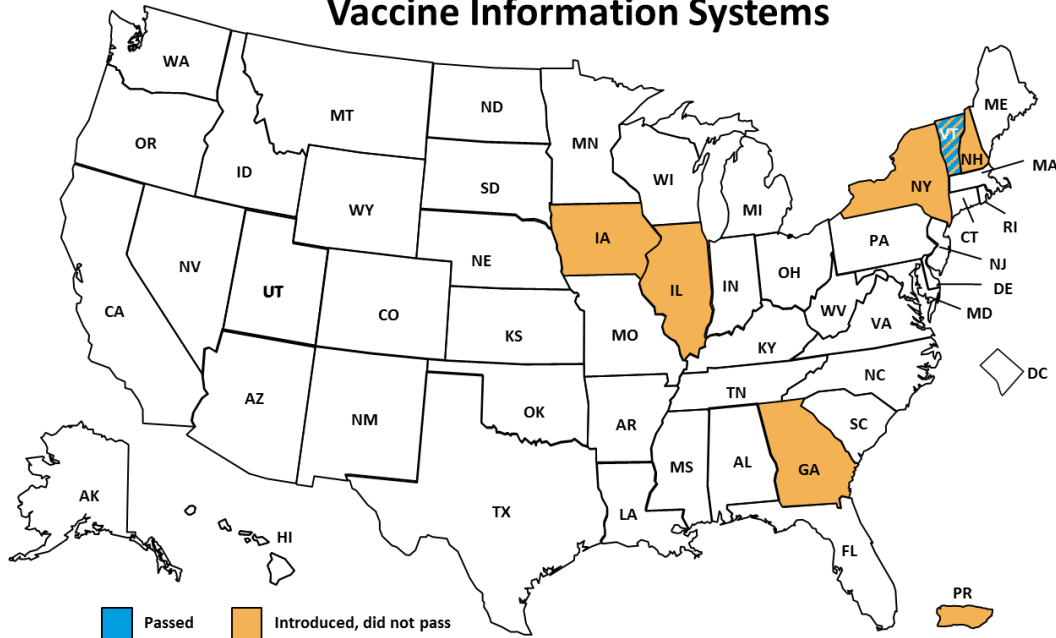

NJ	<a href="#">A 536</a> and <a href="#">S 1640</a>	Provides for a philosophical exemption to mandatory immunizations by written, notarized statement.	Did not pass
NJ	<a href="#">A 568</a>	Provides for a medical exemption from an influenza vaccine based on an allergy to any vaccine ingredient.	Did not pass
NM	<a href="#">HB 522</a>	Removes the religious exemption for school vaccinations.	Did not pass

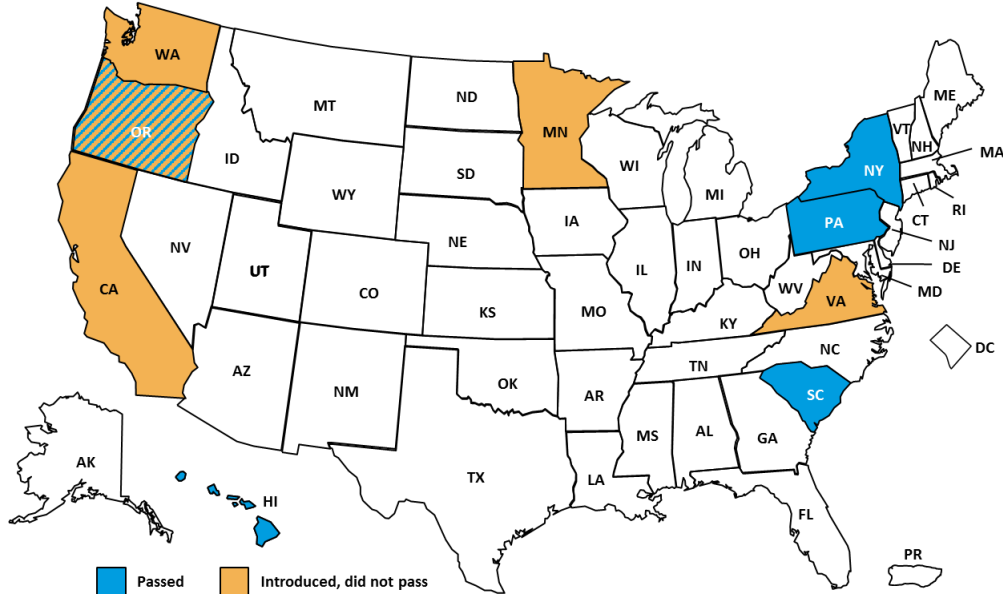

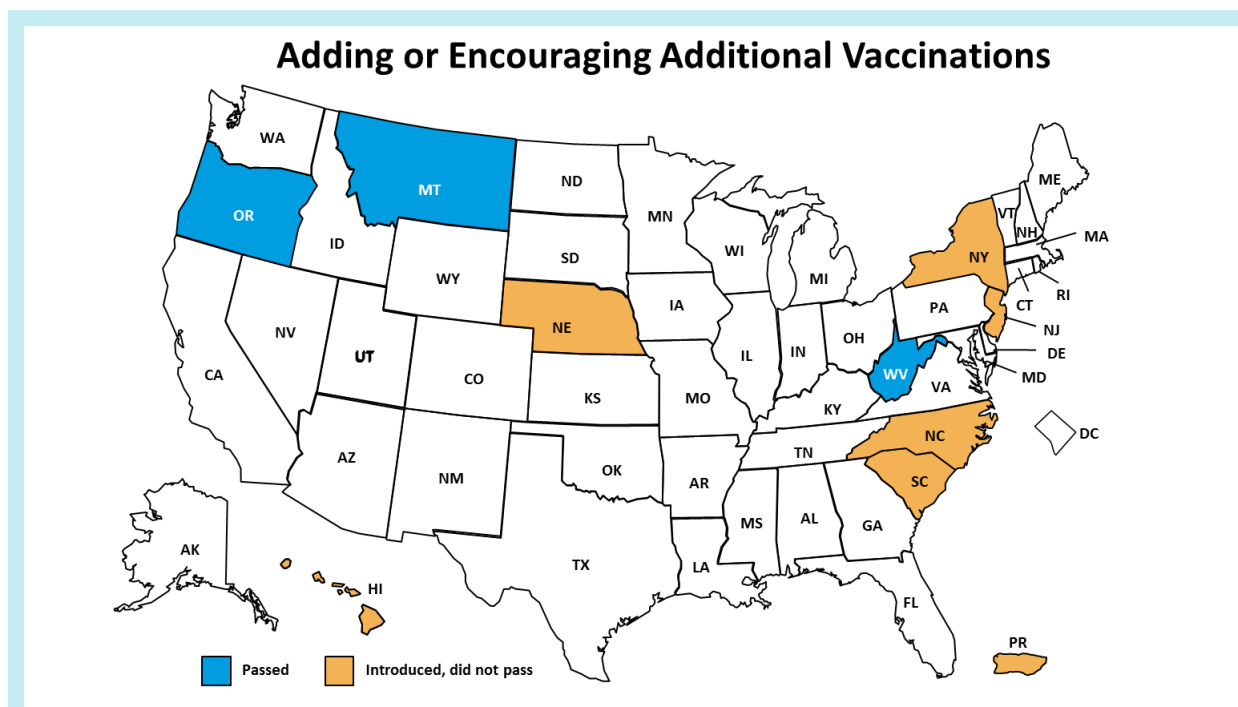

GA	<a href="#">HB 155</a>	Requires any person, pharmacy, agency, or business that employs a person that administers vaccines to register with the vaccine registry to record immunizations.	Did not pass
IA	<a href="#">HSB 147</a>	Requires pharmacies and pharmacists administering vaccines to patients aged 6 to 17 to report immunizations to the statewide registry within 30 days.	Did not pass
IL	<a href="#">HB 4213</a>	Allows pharmacists to vaccinate people between ages 10 and 13 with MMR and meningococcal vaccines, requires the pharmacist to notify the primary care physician if he or she vaccinates a person under the age of 18, and requires recording of the vaccination in the state-wide registry.	Did not pass
NH	<a href="#">SB 130</a> and <a href="#">HB 383</a>	Exempts the immunization registry from right-to-know laws.	Did not pass
NY	<a href="#">SB 3898</a>	Makes reporting of adult vaccination administration mandatory.	Did not pass
PR	<a href="#">PC 2502</a>	Strengthens systems to monitor childhood vaccinations.	Did not pass

HI	<a href="#">HB 253</a>	Allows pharmacists to vaccinate people between 14 and 17 years old if they have a valid prescription from the patient's medical home.	Passed
MN	<a href="#">HF 1659</a> and <a href="#">SF 1765</a>	Changes the ages at which pharmacists can administer vaccinations (from age 10 to 6 for flu vaccines and from age 18 to 13 for all other vaccines) under a written physician protocol and requires a pharmacist who administers vaccines to use the state-wide immunization registry.	Did not pass
NY	<a href="#">AB 123</a> and <a href="#">SB 4739</a>	Expands the diseases for which a pharmacist can administer a vaccine to an adult under a written order from a physician and authorizes the commissioner of health to issue a state-wide non-specific protocol in the event of an imminent threat of an outbreak.	Passed
OR	<a href="#">SB 520</a>	Allows pharmacists to administer vaccines to patients over 7.	Passed
OR	<a href="#">SB 673</a>	Allows licensed dentists to administer certain vaccines.	Did not pass
PA	<a href="#">HB 182</a> and <a href="#">SB 305</a>	Allows pharmacists to provide injectable flu vaccines to adults and other forms to those over the age of 7.	Passed
SC	<a href="#">S 413</a>	Allows pharmacists to administer vaccines to adults under a written protocol.	Passed

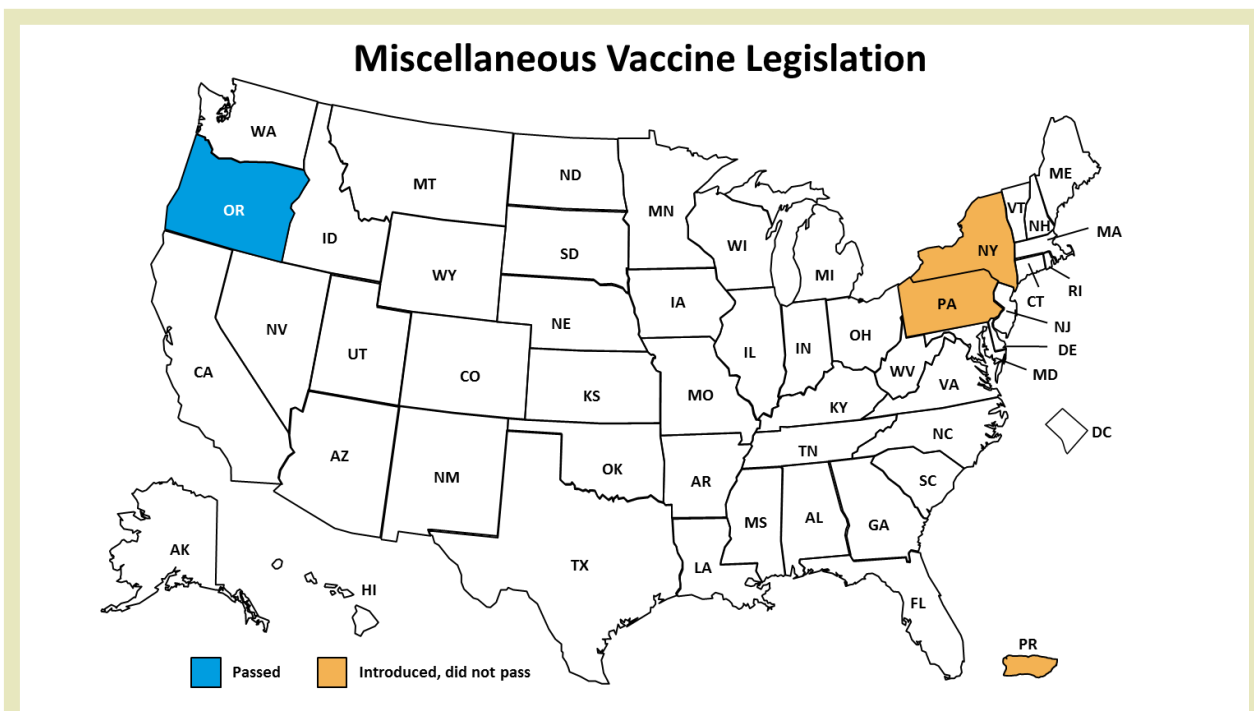
VA	<a href="#">HB 1342</a>	Adds physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and licensed practical nurses to the types of health practitioners who may administer vaccinations.	Did not pass
WA	<a href="#">SB 5822</a>	Allows pharmacists to administer vaccines to patients older than the age of 3.	Did not pass
